In early March, Fr. Karl Kaiser, provincial of the Midwest Province of the Jesuits, visited Manresa for a day. As part of his ministry of leadership, he spoke individually with each of our resident Jesuits, as well as with Board President Mike Timm and me.

In summer, Manresa reserves four blocks of time for individual retreats, with the opportunity to meet one-on-one with a Jesuit or trained lay person. The experience can help you slow down, become more aware of God's love and presence in your life, and help deepen a loving relationship with God. There's a special atmosphere in the house when people come together for a shared purpose, growing closer to the Lord and to one another in silent, prayerful communion.

"In-session" dates allow for eight-day retreats as well as retreats of shorter duration (four-day minimum within session dates/ times). Arrival time begins at 5:00 PM on the opening date of the retreat session, dinner is at 6:00 PM and the retreat itself begins at 7:30 PM. The retreat ends at 10:00 AM on the closing date of the retreat session. Alternately, individuals may choose "out-of-session" dates for individually directed retreats between September and April each year.
