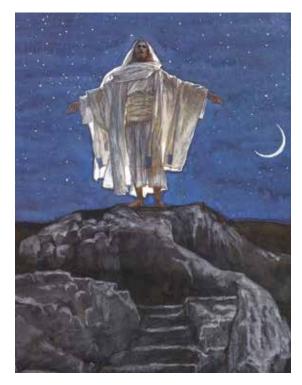

For authenticity's sake, he based his paintings on three years of sketching and photographing in the Holy Land, thought to be at that time virtually unchanged from the time of Christ.

Scripture Study: Wisdom Literature



In a famous song from *Fiddler on the Roof*, Tevye sings "Tradition." Before tradition, there was wisdom. What was wisdom? It was the understanding of how a person with faith lived in a changing world—an ancient need, a current need. How do we live in a world with many and diverse intellectual perspectives? Learning from the past is a clue to the present.

We will study three books from different moments in the history of wisdom: The Wisdom of Solomon, The Wisdom of Ben Sira (Ecclesiasticus) and one of Philo's essays. Join us as we study the past to find a way to the future!

Learning from the Mystics: Teresa of Avila

In St. Teresa of Avila's spiritual classic, *The Interior Castle*, she leads us along the seven stages of soul development, offering profound and inspiring reflections on such subjects as self-knowledge, humility, detachment and suffering.

In this seven-week series, we will listen to and discuss Dr. James Finley's reflections on St. Teresa's *Castle*. A clinical psychologist, author and modern mystic, Finley invites us to be drawn into deeper communion with God.

We will use the podcasts from Season 2 of "Turning to the Mystics" (free from cac.org/podcast/turning-to-the-mystics). Participants are asked to spend 30-40 minutes a day listening to part of a podcast, reflecting on it, briefly journaling and sitting in silence with it. Before the first class, please listen to the episode titled "Turning to Teresa of Avila (8/24/20)" and the bonus episode "The Life and Work of Teresa (6/15/20)."

Facilitator: Rosemary Insley is a retired chaplain and bereavement counselor with master's degrees in pastoral studies and social work. As a spiritual companion, she guides others in the Spiritual Exercises and in retreats.

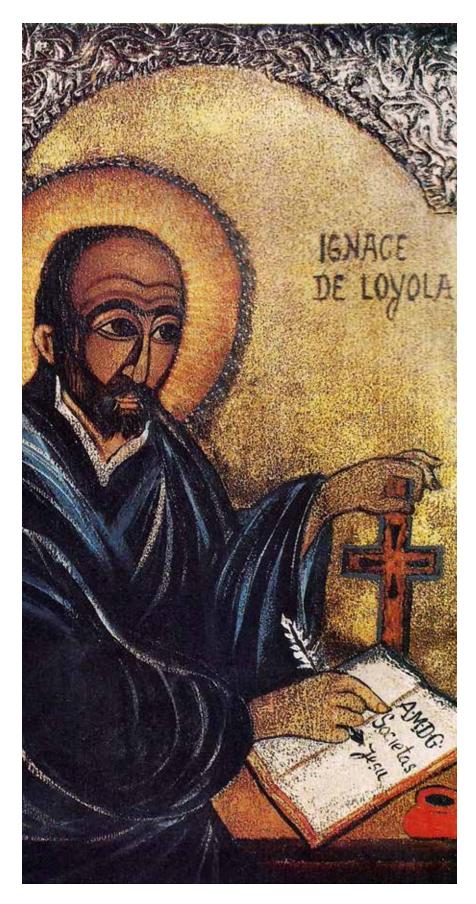

Praying with the Spiritual Exercises



The Spiritual Exercises, developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola, offer a way to grow in prayer; to develop a real and personal relationship with God; to see more clearly God's presence in creation, your personal life story and current life circumstances; and to know Jesus more intimately, love Him more deeply and follow Him more closely.

At Manresa we offer several ways of praying and reflecting on the meditations and themes of the Spiritual Exercises in the midst of your daily life. Each experience requires a significant commitment of time for daily prayer on specific Scripture selections and weekly meetings with a director via Zoom, Facetime, phone or in person. *An offering of \$25 per session is appropriate.* Retreatants are also responsible for the cost of materials as required.

A home retreat that starts whenever you're ready

Choose the format that works best for you:

- **Eight Weeks** Pray daily for 30 minutes for eight weeks using retreat content offered online.
- **12 Weeks** Pray daily for 30 to 45 minutes for 12 weeks using a prayer workbook/journal with daily scripture and reflections.
- **30 Days** Pray daily for 30 to 45 minutes aided by 30 sequential reflections for prayer and meditation available in a book or online.
- 10 Months (19th Annotation Retreat) A daily commitment of 60 to 90 minutes of prayer and reflection centered on the themes of the *Exercises* for approximately nine or 10 months.
