Mary McKeon Plaque Dedication




Join us as we celebrate former Director of Women's Ministry (2006–2013) Mary McKeon's life and generous

Smithsonian offers online lecture on Jesuits in the United States

The Smithsonian Institution is offering an Evening Lecture/Seminar on *The Jesuits in the United States: A Modern Perspective on 500 Years* via Zoom on **Thursday, Aug. 31, 2023, 6:45 PM to 8:00 PM** (ET). Led by David J. Collins, SJ, an associate professor at Georgetown University and author of *The Jesuits in the United States: A Concise History*, the presentation offers a panoramic overview of the Jesuit order in the United States from the colonial era to the present and places



it against the backdrop of American religious, cultural and social history. He compares the historical relationship of Jesuit activities in America to those in Europe and, by the 20th century, to those around the world as political and religious connections between the U.S. and other countries, especially in Latin America, grow.

Icons belong in churches, not museums; they are sacred objects for the prayer corners of our homes, not decorations for anywhere else. They not only recall historical persons and events, but they are windows into heaven that put us into direct contact with the holy persons or with the enduring heavenly reality of the events portrayed.
